#### YEAR 3

We are now moving on to another story from the Old Testament. It is also in the book of Genesis and is the story of Joseph. (There is a very famous musical all about the story called Joseph and his Technicolour Dreamcoat – ask your parents as they may well know it and even be able to sing a bit from it! It is one of my favourite musicals!). We are going to be spending two lessons on it so choose one activity from the list below on one day and next time you do R.E. choose a different activity.

#### Activities

1. Divide a piece of paper into two halves by drawing a line down the middle of the page. At the top of one side write Good Times and at the top of the other side write Bad Times. Now list as many good and bad things that you can remember from the story that happened to Joseph.
2. Design a coat for one of the other brothers so that they are all happy.
3. Draw a picture illustrating one of Joseph's dreams.
4. Complete the crossword in the R.E. Resources folder.
5. Complete the wordsearch in the R.E. Resources folder.
6. Draw a strip cartoon of part of the story – see the sheet 'Joseph and his Brothers Strip Cartoon' in the R.E. Resources folder.

## YEAR 4

### Islam - Journey to Mecca.

The fifth and final pillar of Islam is **Hajj**, where Muslims take a journey to the Kaaba (the house of God) and surrounding holy sites. The journey is of great significance to Muslims, should be conducted at least once in their lifetime, and takes great planning. The Hajj takes place during the 12<sup>th</sup> month of the Islamic calendar, this year 28<sup>th</sup> July to 2<sup>nd</sup> August.
